Received a CMS 5-star rating for cleanliness

CMS's Patient survey (HCAHPS) listed hospital ratings based on the Hospital Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems surveys. This is a national, standardized survey of hospital patients about their experience during a recent inpatient hospital stay. The surveys were completed between October 2022 and September 2023.

Received a CMS 4-star quality rating

The CMS rating system evaluates hospitals based on various quality measures, including mortality rates, safety of care, readmissions and patient experience. CRMC has surpassed national averages in preventing mortality, ensuring safety and enhancing patient experience.

Received the American Heart Association's Get with the Guidelines Gold Plus Quality Achievement Award

This award was achieved through our commitment to improving outcomes for patients with heart failure, meaning reduced readmissions and more healthy days at home.

Recognized on the American Heart Association's Target: Heart Failure Honor Roll

Hospitals on the Honor Roll meet specific criteria that improve medication adherence, provide early follow-up care and coordination and enhance patient education.

Placed on the American Heart Association's Target: Type 2 Diabetes Honor Roll for ensuring patients with type 2 diabetes receive the most up-to-date, evidence-based care when hospitalized due to heart disease or stroke.

CRMG unveils new comprehensive care clinic: CRMG Orthopedic & Surgical Specialists

This clinic, formerly known as Wyoming Orthopedics and Sports Medicine, opened on the fifth floor of CRMC's Medical Office Building in August of 2024. Integrating various specialties, including General, Plastic, Reconstructive, Cosmetic and Hand Surgery, Pain Management, Orthopedic, Physical Therapy and Occupational Therapy, signifies a shift towards collaborative healthcare delivery. By consolidating these services under one roof, CRMG Orthopedic & Surgical Specialists aims to provide enhanced care that is tailored to each patient's needs. Convenient parking options, including level E of the parking garage and valet services at the front entrance, will make accessing care at the new clinic effortless.

CRMC unveils state-of-the-art hybrid operating room

This new cutting-edge Hybrid Operating Room opened in July of 2024, integrating the latest in medical technology. Equipped with Phillips ClaritylQ technology, this new hybrid operating room reduces X-ray exposure by an impressive 50% to 85%, prioritizing patient and staff safety while maintaining exceptional image quality. The Hybrid Operating Room boasts two 55" high-definition monitors, facilitating crystal-clear images and video playback for enhanced visualization during procedures. Utilizing the Phillips Azurion 7 system, the room offers conical CT scans, rotational imaging and advanced 3D reconstructions of vessels and structures, setting a new standard in precision healthcare.

Introducing the Nuvision Ice Catheter for enhanced cardiac procedures at CRMC

Dr. Lawand, an electrophysiologist at CRMC and CRMG's Heart and Vascular Institute, utilized the cutting-edge Nuvision ice catheter for Watchman procedures for the first time in August of 2024. This marks a significant milestone as CRMC becomes the pioneering hospital on the front range to introduce this revolutionary technology. The Nuvision ice catheter, developed by Biosense Webster under J&J MedTech, sets a new standard in cardiac care by offering unparalleled advantages. This state-of-the-art catheter provides superior imaging quality and precise navigation capabilities during Watchman procedures. Its advanced ultrasound features enable exceptional clarity in the real-time visualization of cardiac structures, enhancing procedural accuracy and reducing the risk of complications.

CRMC hosts first annual Navigating Diabetes Symposium

CRMC will host the first annual Navigating Diabetes Symposium in November of 2024. This comprehensive event is designed to provide valuable education, resources and support for adults and children with diabetes. The symposium will feature two tracks: one for adults and one for youth patients up to age 19.

Cheyenne Regional Medical Center announces launch of state-of-the-art emergency department blood kiosk

Previously, the process of obtaining blood products for patients in critical need could take up to nine minutes, posing risks during emergencies. With the new blood kiosk, emergency room staff can now access and administer blood in just 30 seconds, vastly improving response times and reducing the risk of complications for patients.
